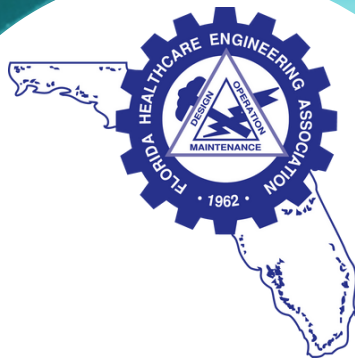

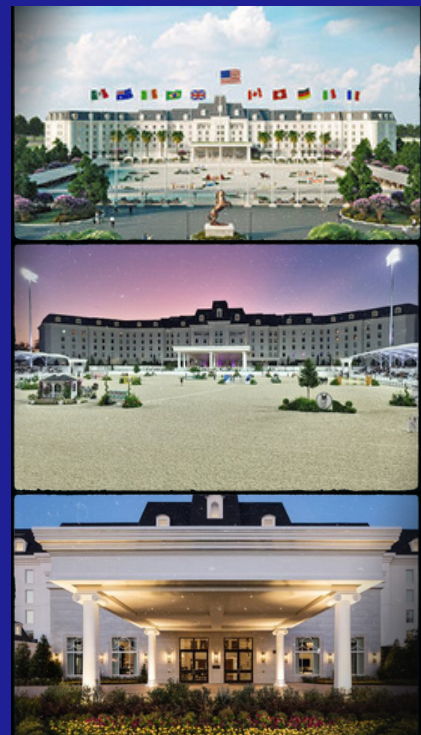

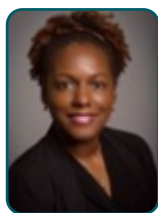

CODES AND STANDARDS

THE JOINT COMMISSION MAKES CHANGES TO MORE THAN 60 ENVIRONMENT OF CARE (EC) ELEMENTS OF PERFORMANCE (EPs)

Effective the end of August 2023, The Joint Commission revised, consolidated, or deleted more than 60 EC EPs in efforts to keep up with their standards reduction initiative. This second phase of modifications totals more than 200 changes that The Joint Commission has made since late last year to better streamline requirements and make the EPs efficient for the safety and quality of patients.

The six accreditation programs where modification was made to their EC standards were:

- Ambulatory Care (AHC)—3 standards and 8 EPs
- Behavioral Health Care and Human Services (BHC)—2 standards and 6 EPs
- Critical Access Hospital (CAH)—3 standards and 11 EPs
- Laboratory Accreditation Program (LAB)—8 standards and 20 EPs
- Nursing Care Center (NCC)—1 standard and 11 EPs
- Office-Based Surgery (OBS)—4 standards and 7 EPs
-

EPs have been consolidated into other comprehensive EPs to allow for similar requirements to be put together. Any EPs that were deleted were thought to be redundant to other requirements or were rarely cited due to them becoming the standard of care by healthcare organizations. The changes give more consistent wording of the EPs throughout accreditation programs and help organizations address challenges faced were by removing standards that do not add value to accreditation surveys.

Picture this. It is a cool December evening; a person is sitting quietly on a porch. Just sitting, thinking, and watching the sun go down.

For Facilities Managers/Engineers, those moments are cherished, and they don't come often enough. We often work late to make sure everything is running smoothly for the night to come. Our calling is to provide an environment that allows people to take care of our patients properly.

Engineers may not personally take care of the patient, but what we do plays a crucial role in the patient having a safe, clean, and comfortable environment during that care.

It takes several systems to provide an ideal environment. These systems should be maintained using the latest technologies, codes, and standards. FHEA provides opportunities to gain experience about those technologies, codes, and standards.

When we say the words safe, clean, and comfortable, it can refer to several systems. HVAC Systems requires clean and safe air delivered at a comfortable temperature. Electrical Systems operate at maximum efficiency using clean and safe electricity, delivered to diverse types of equipment.

Yes, I said clean electricity. If dirty electricity is delivered to delicate medical equipment, it will not perform correctly and therefore, compromises the care the patient receives.

The next time you are enjoying a nice quiet, comfortable evening, think of all your facility does to keep people safe, clean, and comfortable.

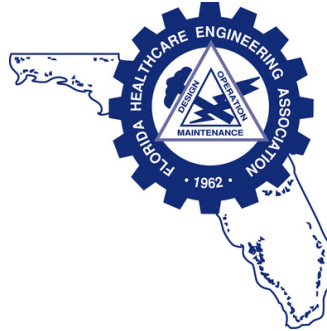
