

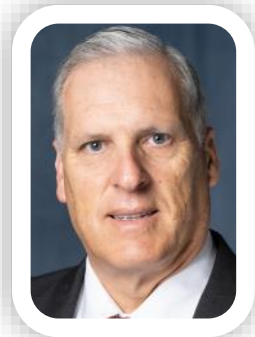

As change is the new normal for the general population, Hospital Engineers have lived this change for decades -

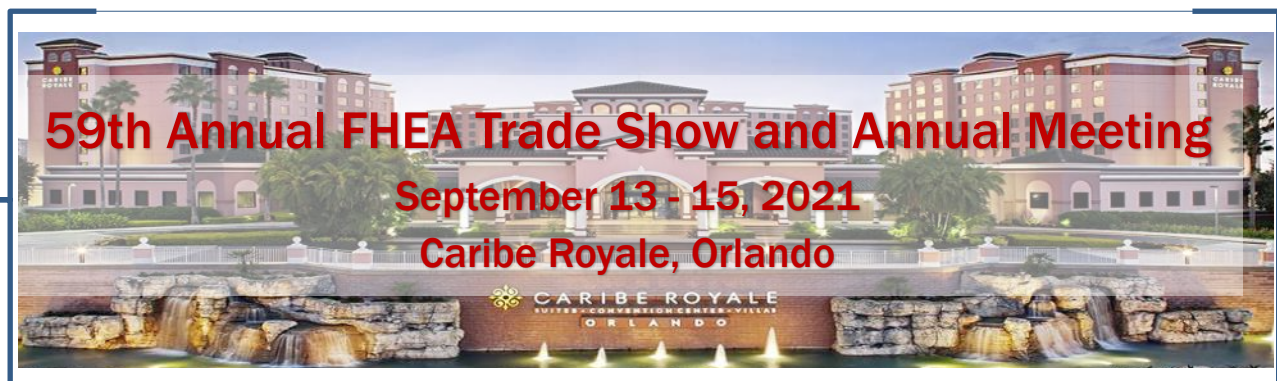

Ex-POW Iraq 2003

Jessica Lynch is a former United States Army soldier who served in the 2003 invasion of Iraq. On March 23, 2003, Private First Class Lynch's convoy was ambushed by Iraqi forces during the Battle of Nasiriyah.

Lynch was seriously injured and captured. Her subsequent recovery by U.S. Special Operations Forces was the first successful rescue of an American female prisoner of war since WW2. Jessica has been awarded the Bronze Star, Purple Heart, and Prisoner of War medals.

She has a Bachelor's degree in Elementary Education and Master's degree in Communication Studies.

Dr. Dale Henry grew up in the foothills of the Smoky Mountains, an area that is bountiful in two things—hospitality and story-telling. 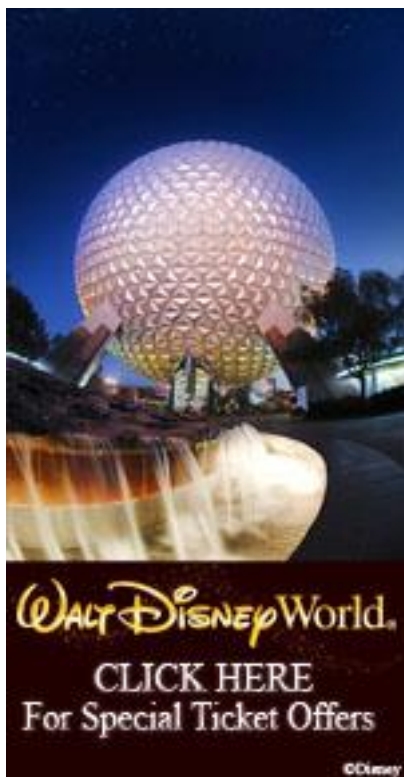

EFFECTIVE COVID CLEANING: CHEMICALS ARE A MUST

As a Facilities professional, you have likely been contacted by several companies offering you products and services that kill covid. With many of them seemingly springing up overnight, these companies offer UV light filtration, HEPA filtration, UV light filtration combined with HEPA filtration, plasma filtration, hydrogen peroxide fogging, etc. While many of the products being offered may kill covid, they are not all approved for use by the CDC.

One of the most popular methods is HEPA filtration. We are all familiar with the benefits of HEPA filtration and I have deployed more than 100 air scrubbers with HEPA filters throughout my facility in hopes of decreasing potential covid concentrations. The issue with filtration is that it only works when the virus passes through the filter and gets caught and not when it is adhered to a surface. Because of this, HEPA filtration is not actively killing the covid virus and is not an approved method. HEPA filtered air scrubbers do increase air exchanges and can reduce the recommended room turn-around time, but HEPA filtration alone is not effective at killing the covid virus.



UV light is another popular product being sold as a means of killing the covid virus. UV light is very effective at cleaning air and reducing buildup on coils, but there are a few factors to be considered before using it for covid purposes. The UV light has to be intense enough to kill the virus, it has to shine on the virus

long enough, and it has to be in the direct line of sight of the virus. A light that is too weak, not on long enough, or has something blocking its line of sight to the virus will not work correctly and could place lives at risk. The ECRI Institute has identified this as a safety issue and recently sent to their membership their concerns about using UV light as a means of killing the virus. For these reasons, UV light alone is not approved by the CDC as a means of killing the covid virus.

According to the CDC website, the only way to guarantee you are properly ridding a room of the covid virus is with chemicals and there are 542 approved chemicals that have been proven effective.

HEPA filtration, UV light, and other methods may serve their purpose alongside these approved chemicals, but they are not approved methods of killing the virus alone.

If you are one of the many facilities using hydrogen peroxide fogging, you can relax because it's on the list.

OSHA CREATES PROGRAM TO PROTECT WORKERS FROM COVID-19

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) has created a National Emphasis Program (NEP) to help protect health care employees and other employees in high-hazard industries where there is higher risk of contracting COVID-19. The NEP was developed not only to protect workers from potential exposure, but also to protect workers from retaliation.

OSHA is working to prevent retaliation, distribute anti-retaliation information during inspections and outreach opportunities, and promptly refer allegations of retaliation to the Whistleblower Protection Program. Based on the individual variability of COVID-19 protective requirements in place across all state plans, OSHA strongly encourages states to adopt this NEP but does not require identical adoption.

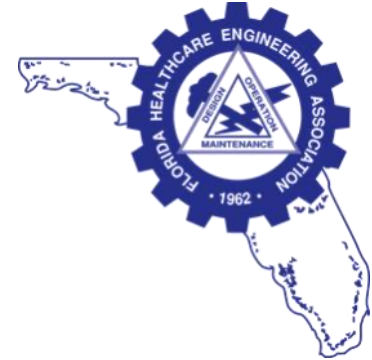
